Special days

PrathOsa: It is observed on the thirteenth lunar day—trayodasi—on both the bighter and darker halves of each month. Pradosha kaala is the time before the sunset. Siva devotees fast on this day and go to Sivan temple and worship Him by getting His view through the space between the two horns of the Nandi at the front during pradosha kaala They also go round in the temple by **Soma-sutra pradakshiNa**, a special way of going round the temple on pradosha time. It signifies the event of Siva drinking poison to save the celestials.

Chaturthi: Ganesha's special day Chaturthi is the fourth lunar day comes twice a month, once during brighter half (waxing moon) and the other one during darker half (waning moon) of each month. The Chaturthi on the brighter half in the month of AavaNi is very special festival for Ganesha. People observe fasting and feasting on this day. Ganesha is worshipped by aruku grass and erukku flower. He is offered with coconuts, fruits, modakam, pongal and sundal and many more. Of course we will get these as Prasad at the end of Puja.

Sivarathri

The moon is the presiding deity of the mind. There is a close affinity between the mind and the moon. Both are subject to decline and progress. The waning of the moon is the symbol for the waning of the mind, for the mind has to be controlled, reduced, and finally destroyed. All spiritual practices are directed towards this end. Manohara, the mind has to be killed so that Maya can be rent asunder, and the reality revealed.

Everyday during the dark half of the month, the moon and symbolically, its counterpart in man, the mind, wane and a fraction is diminished. Its power declines. Finally, on the fourteenth night, the Chadhurdasi, there is just a wee bit left. That is all. If a little extra effort is made that day by the spiritual aspirant, even that bit can be wiped off, and the death of the mind (mano nigraha) completed.

The Chadurdasi of the dark half is ...called Siva Ratri, for the night should be spent in the japa (continual repetition of the name of the Lord) and dhyana (meditation of Siva without any other thought, either of food or sleep). The success is assured. Once a year, on Maha Siva Ratri night, a special spurt of spiritual activity is recommended, so that what is savam (corpse) can become Sivam by removal of dross, called manas.

This is the purpose of Siva Ratri. So, it is foolish and even harmful deceit to image that "keeping awake" is the essential thing in its observance. People try to escape sleep on this night by playing cards, attending cinema shows and dramas. That is not the spiritual practice which should be intensified on Siva Ratri. It is a travesty of the vow of "sleeplessness". It vulgarizes you and encourages evil sloth, wickedness and hypocrisy.

You cannot claim to be educated or grown-up unless you have mastered the science of self-control and destroyed the root cause of delusion. It is not this night alone that you should spend in the thought of Siva. Your whole life should be lived in the constant presence of the Lord.

Kochenkat chola Navanaaar:

He was king of Chola Empire. He had built seventy temples for Lord Siva. He worshipped Lord Siva in the form of a spider in his previous birth

Kari Nayanaar:

He hailed from a village called Thirukakadavur . He wrote Kovai (Kind of love poem) and sold them for cash and kind. With the help of money so earned, he rendered his service in the Siva temple

Eripaththa Nayanaar:

He lived in Karuvur. He had killed the royal elephant that had snatched away the flower basket meant for Lord Shiva from the hands of a Saiva Devotee.

Thiruvalluvar: is a celebrated Tamil poet and philosopher whose contribution to Tamil literature is the *Thirukkural*, a work on ethics. He was born in Mylapore), Chen nai in Tamil Nadu .Thiruvalluvar lived around 2000 years ago.

Kachiyappa Sivachariyar: He lived at Kanchipuram approximately 1,100 years ago. Kachiyappa Sivachariyar was a very fortunate and blessed devotee of Lord Murugan. Before the age of 10, he mastered all learning including his specialty, the Sivāgamas. Lord Murugan one day appeared to him in a dream and ordered, "My boy, thou shalt sing Kantha Purana, in Tamil translating from the Sanskrit work, Sankara Samhita, and having for your first line, *'Tigadachakkara'.'* "Kachiyappa Sivachariar awoke and thought over this wonder, and thought over and over again, the kind commission accorded to him by his Lord. He took up the task and finished it suitably. Today we have Kantha Puranam, The story of Murugan in Tamil, consist of 10345 poems
